Mr. Whitney introduced Local Law No. 1 of the year 1952, providing salary increases for certain county officers.

LOCAL LAW NUMBER ONE, 1952
COUNTY OF LIVINGSTON, NEW YORK
A LOCAL LAW PROVIDING SALARY INCREASES FOR CERTAIN
COUNTY OFFICERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE
COUNTY OF LIVINGSTON AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Effective as hereinafter provided, the salary of the Livingston County Children's Court Judge shall be Twenty-five Hundred Dollars (\$2500.00) per annum, to be paid in equal monthly installments.

Section 2. Effective as hereinafter provided, the cost of living adjustment in the salary of the Livingston County Treasurer shall be increased by \$200.00, and the cost of living adjustment in the salary of the Livingston County Attorney shall be increased by \$100.00.

Section 3. This Local Law shall take effect on January 1st, 1953.

**RESOLUTION PERTAINING TO PUBLIC HEARING ON
PROPOSED LOCAL LAW**

WHEREAS there has been duly presented and introduced at a meeting of this Board held on September 29th, 1952, a proposed Local Law entitled "A Local Law Providing Salary Increases for Certain County Officers", now, be it hereby

RESOLVED that a public hearing shall be held on the said proposed Local Law by this Board on the 14th day of October, 1952, at two o'clock P. M., in the Board of Supervisors Room in the Court House in the Village of Geneseo, N. Y., and at least six days notice of such hearing shall be given by the Clerk of this Board by the due posting thereof on the bulletin board of the Court House of this County, and by publishing such notice at least once in the official newspapers of the County, as provided by law.
