

Mr. Sipperley introduced Local Law No. 1 for the year 1959 as follows:

LOCAL LAW NUMBER ONE, 1959
COUNTY OF LIVINGSTON, NEW YORK
A LOCAL LAW PROVIDING SALARY INCREASES
FOR CERTAIN COUNTY OFFICERS

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LIVINGSTON AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Effective as hereinafter provided, the minimum and maximum salary of the Children's Court Judge shall be increased by \$50.00.

Section 2. Effective as hereinafter provided, the minimum and maximum salary of the County Treasurer shall be increased by \$100.00.

Section 3. Effective as hereinafter provided, the minimum and maximum salary of the County Superintendent of Highways shall be increased by \$300.00.

Section 4. Effective as hereinafter provided, the minimum and maximum salary of the Commissioner of Public Welfare shall be increased by \$100.00.

Section 5. This Local Law shall take effect on January 1st, 1960.
