

ADJOURNED MEETING

MONDAY, OCTOBER 15, 1962
9:30 A. M.

The Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The roll was called showing all members present except Messrs. Alger, Parker, Roeser, Gibson and Lown.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Adamson as Chairman of the Finance Committee presented the Tentative Budget for 1963 as prepared by the Budget Officer.

Messrs. Alger, Parker, Roeser, Gibson and Lown are seated.

Motion was made by Mr. Adamson and seconded by Mr. Derrenbacher that the Board recess and reconvene as a Committee of the Whole for the purpose of making a study of the Tentative Budget for 1963. Carried.

Motion was made by Mr. Dunkley and seconded by Mr. Adamson that Mr. Hart act as Chairman and Edith L. Campbell act as Secretary of the Committee of the Whole. Carried.

The Chairman declared a recess.

Afternoon Session

The Board reconvened as a Committee of the Whole for further study of the Tentative Budget.

The Board re-assembled.

The Chairman announced that a report of the Committee of the Whole will be presented after a complete review of the Tentative Budget has been made.

Mr. Forsythe presented Local Law No. 1 for the year 1962 as follows:

LOCAL LAW NO. 1, 1962, COUNTY OF LIVINGSTON A LOCAL LAW PROVIDING SALARY INCREASES FOR CERTAIN COUNTY OFFICERS

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LIVINGSTON AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Effective as hereinafter provided, the minimum and maximum salary of the County Treasurer shall be increased by \$500.00.

Section 2. Effective as hereinafter provided, the minimum and maximum salary of the County Attorney shall be increased by \$50.00.

Section 3. Effective as hereinafter provided, the minimum and maximum salaries of two (2) Commissioners of Elections shall be increased by \$50.00.

Section 4. Effective as hereinafter provided, the minimum and max-

imum salary of the County Superintendent of Highways shall be increased by \$100.00 and the time service increment shall be increased by \$150.00.

Section 5. Effective as hereinafter provided, the minimum and maximum salary of the Commissioner of Public Welfare shall be increased by \$500.00 and the time service increment shall be increased by \$150.00.

Section 6. This Local Law shall take effect on January 1, 1963.

Resolution No. 62-138. Mr. Forsythe presented the following resolution and moved its adoption:

**RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED
LOCAL LAW**

WHEREAS, there has been duly presented and introduced at a meeting of this Board held on October 15, 1962, a proposed Local Law entitled A Local Law Providing Salary Increases for Certain County Officers, now, be it hereby

RESOLVED that a public hearing shall be held on the said proposed Local Law by this Board on the 5th day of November, 1962 at 10:00 A. M. in the Board of Supervisors' Room in the Court House in the Village of Geneseo, New York, and at least six days notice of such hearing shall be given by the Clerk of the Board by the due posting thereof on the bulletin board of the Court House of this County, and by publishing such notice at least once in the official newspapers of the County, as provided by law.
