Mr. Roeser presented Local Law No. 1 for 1969 as follows:

A LOCAL LAW, COUNTY OF LIVINGSTON, ESTABLISHING A
LIVINGSTON COUNTY TRAFFIC SAFETY BOARD

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LIVINGSTON AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to Article 43 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York, there is hereby established the Livingston County Traffic Safety Board.

Section 2. Membership of said Board shall be appointed by this Board of Supervisors at a later date.

Section 3. This Local Law shall take effect on September 5, 1969.

Resolution No. 69-144. Mr. Roeser presented the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED LOCAL LAW

WHEREAS, there has been duly presented and introduced at a meeting of this Board held on August 11, 1969, a proposed Local Law entitled "A Local Law, Establishing a Livingston County Traffic Safety Board", now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that a public hearing shall be held on the said proposed Local Law by this Board on the 5th day of September, 1969 at 1:30 P. M. in the Board of Supervisors Room in the Court House in the Village of Geneseo, New York, and at least six days notice of such hearing shall be given by the Clerk of the Board by the due posting thereof on the bulletin board of the Court House of this County, and by publishing such notice at least once in the official newspapers of the County, as provided by law.
