 \_\_\_\_\_ of the second part, **WITNESSETH,**

That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of *Twenty*  
*Dollars* *Twelve & a half cents* \_\_\_\_\_ to them in hand paid, have  
 granted, bargained, and sold, and by these presents, Do grant, bargain, and sell, unto the  
 said party of the second part and to *his* heirs and assigns forever, the sole and ex-  
 clusive use and enjoyment of *the One Equal undivided one half of*  
 \_\_\_\_\_ Slip Number *Thirty* \_\_\_\_\_ in the Meeting-House or House of  
 Worship now belonging to the said parties of the first part, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD,  
 the same for the purposes of Public Worship, unto the said party of the second part, and  
 to *his* heirs and assigns forever.
