Livingston County Seeks Input on Hazard Mitigation Plan Update

GENESEO, N.Y., August 16, 2021 — Livingston County is updating its Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP) in 2021 per the five-year update cycle required of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000.

The HMP analyzes Livingston County’s vulnerabilities to natural and human-caused hazards – such as floods, severe weather, and cyberattacks – and identifies mitigation actions the County can take to minimize property damage and reduce the loss of life by lessening the impacts of disasters.

Heather Ferrero, Livingston County’s Deputy Planning Director, stated, “Local knowledge is critical to the success of this Hazard Mitigation Plan. As part of the current planning process, we are asking residents and business owners to provide input on the types of natural hazards that impact Livingston County as well as location-specific information related to these impacts.”



Information Bulletin: A Primer for Individuals and Stakeholders

Why is a Hazard Mitigation Plan update important?

The Livingston County Planning Department has begun the process of updating the county-wide Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP). The HMP analyzes the hazards faced by all towns and villages in the county, and identifies strategies to minimize vulnerability to known natural and man-made hazards.

The HMP update process is being conducted in accordance with requirements of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA 2000). At the end of the process, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will review and approve the updated plan.

Tetra Tech, Inc. has deep experience in hazard mitigation and was selected by the county to guide the HMP planning process to a successful conclusion, including approval by FEMA.

The HMP update will assess and respond to risks posed by 13 different hazards;

- ◆ Drought
- ◆ Earthquake
- ◆ Flood
- ◆ Hazmat
- ◆ Invasive Species
- ◆ Landslide
- ◆ Mine Subsidence
- ◆ Pandemic
- ◆ Severe Storm
- ◆ Winter Storm
- ◆ Terrorism
- ◆ Utility Failure
- ◆ Wildfire

Livingston County’s citizens, partner agencies, visitors, and business owners face a wide variety of natural and man-made hazards. These hazards can threaten lives, damage property, and interrupt a wide variety of day-to-day operations. By maintaining an up-to-date Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP) and implementing the projects described within it, the impact of hazards can be reduced county-wide and in each town and village.

Citizens can reduce their own vulnerability by increasing awareness about all hazards and preparing for those hazards most likely to impact their home and community. It is important to note that, by completing the update, the county’s towns and villages will be eligible for federal funding dedicated to hazard mitigation—municipalities that do not participate in the HMP update will not be able to access these funds.


Livingston County’s HMP was last updated in 2015 and has since expired. The update process kicked off in June 2021 and we are working as a team to gain approval of the HMP from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in March 2022.

What is the general process to update the HMP?

The county has established a Planning Partnership consisting of representatives from Livingston County, plus municipalities and a variety of stakeholder organizations. The Planning Partnership meets periodically and has provided valuable information and guidance for the HMP update process. The Partnership reviewed the hazard risk assessment, the developing mitigation strategy and the HMP’s multiple chapters. The

project consultant, Tetra Tech, Inc., is conducting a detailed quantitative and qualitative hazard analysis that includes predictive modeling of hazard events at specified intensities (e.g., the 1% annual chance flood event or a 500-year earthquake).

The HMP will include a jurisdiction-specific annex for each participating municipality. The annex describes the jurisdiction’s vulnerability to 13 different hazards, discusses the municipality’s capabilities to implement hazard mitigation, and prioritizes the identified mitigation actions that the jurisdiction intends to carry out over the next five years, out to 2027.



The HMP update will contain a rich set of data and maps. The HMP will show how and where your home may be affected by 13 different hazards. This map shows which areas lie within the 1% and 0.2% annual chance flood zones. Is your community impacted by flooding?

How do I get engaged in the HMP update process?

The Hazard Mitigation Plan analyzes the hazards faced by the county and its municipalities and also identifies strategies for minimizing vulnerability to these hazards. 
