RE: Concealed Carry Permit Holder Recertification

There has been a lot of confusion and questions in and around the changes that took place last year with the Concealed Carry Improvement Act (CCIA), specifically in and around Recertification for Carry Conceal Permit holders. In an attempt to address some of that confusion, anyone who has a concealed carry permit will need to recertify three years after permit issuance OR their last recertification.

Q. My concealed carry permit was issued in 2009 I did my initial recertification in January 17, 2018 and again in January of 2023. When do I need to recertify under the new law?

A. You have until January 2026 to recertify, and should then recertify every three years thereafter.

Q. This is my first time to recertify and I'm getting an error that indicates my credentials are not valid/recognized.

A. Unfortunately, we have confirmed this issue with the NY State Police and it is an IT issue. Please contact the county clerk at countyclerk@co.livingston.ny.us and we will help guide you through what needs to be done, or call us at 585-243-7010.
