


Conesus Lake Bathymetric Survey

Found nearby in:

- Cayuga Lake Inlet
- Cayuga Lake, near Ithaca, NY
- Erie Canal/North Tonawanda Creek

Spiny Waterflea



Found nearby in:

- Keuka Lake
- Lake Ontario
- Allegheny Reservoir
- Lake George

Water Chestnut



Found nearby in:

- Sodus Bay
- Canandaigua West River
- Seneca & Oswego Rivers
- Oneida Lake

Help Keep Hydrilla Out of Conesus Lake!



Hydrilla can grow in up to 25 feet of water. Take a look at the bathymetric map to the left and imagine a dense carpet of hydrilla throughout the shallow areas shaded in red. Please use clean boating practices to prevent the spread of invasive species.

STOP AQUATIC HITCHHIKERS!

Prevent the transport of nuisance species.
Clean all recreational equipment.

✓ Check

Check your boating and fishing equipment for invasive species.

✓ Clean

Clean any visible mud, plants, fish, or other animals before transporting equipment.

✓ Drain

Drain all lake water holding compartments including live wells, bait wells and bilge areas.

✓ Dry

Dry all boats, trailers and equipment before use in another waterbody (towel dry or air dry five days in sun).

✓ Disinfect

Disinfect all areas that came into contact with lake water if it cannot be dried before reuse.*
